If you enjoy talking with the public and sharing your excitement this opportunity is for you. No previous knowledge of miniatures is necessary – however, volunteers with an interest in history, arts and crafts and a genuine desire to learn are vital!

Museum Store Assistants are at ease with the public helping customers with selections but don't mind working behind-the-scenes maintaining the museum store area and creating inviting displays.

Training:

- Monthly training sessions- Training sessions familiarize volunteers with the miniatures in the collection and inform volunteers about current and upcoming programs, events, policy updates and museum store promotions .

Responsibilities:

- Commit to 4 hours of service per week for six months
- Attend monthly training session to get updates on policies, changes in exhibits and current and upcoming programs.
